Parkway Tree Replacement Program

The trees in this brochure are the species available for the Parkway Tree Replacement Program. They have been chosen for their hardiness in this climate and their resistance to disease. This brochure has descriptions and photos of each species available for planting this season.

American Hornbeam is a tall tree that is winter hardy and has no serious pest problems. Leaves, which turn red orange to yellow in autumn and early fall, feel like felt. The tree has a slow growth rate, averaging 10 to 15 feet over 15 years. Blooms in early Spring.

Mature Size: Height: 25 to 40 feet
Width: 15 to 25 feet



Autumn Blaze Maple is known as the fastest growing maple tree with a hardy nature and brilliant color. The tree has a fast growth rate. In drought conditions, the tree can preserve on its own and is winter hardy. The tree poses no serious disease and pest problems. Bloom color in the spring has a reddish tint that turns bright red in the fall.

Mature Size: Height: 40 to 60 feet
Width: 40 to 60 feet



Eastern Redbud is known as the harbinger of spring, the Eastern Redbud's delicate blossoms and buds are one of the season's most dramatic displays. Unique and irregular branching patterns combine with a trunk that commonly divides close to the ground to create a very handsome, spreading and often flat-topped crown. It is adaptable to a wide range of soil conditions. It fares well in drought conditions and can tolerate sun and shade. The tree poses no serious insect or disease problems. **AVAILABLE FOR SPRING PLANTING ONLY.**

Flowering Crabapple is stunning in more than one season. The early spring buds are deep red and open as purple-red blooms. They fade to pinkish red as they age. The early leaves of this tree are also purple and fade to bronze and then to green with maturity. The tree is winter-hardy and able to withstand temperatures as low as -30 degrees. It will take on nearly any soil conditions and is drought resistant. It poses no serious insect or disease problems. The growth rate is slow, approximately 12 inches per year.

Mature Size: Height: 15 to 20 feet
Width: 15 to 25 feet



Ginkgo Biloba (male only) is practically a pest free tree that is resistant to storm damage and casts dense shade. It makes a durable street tree where there is enough overhead space to accommodate its large size. The tree grows in part shade and part sun and is winter hardy. Its bloom color is green in the springtime and yellow in the fall. It poses no serious pest or disease problems.

Mature Size: Height: 25 to 50 feet
Width: 25 to 35 feet



Ivory Silk Japanese Tree Lilac A small tree with stiff branches that is native to Japan. It has a reddish brown, cherry-like bark that becomes gray and scaly with age. The tree grows at a medium rate. It is a vigorous, sturdy, upright tree with a straight trunk. It has dark green foliage and in the late spring bears large creamy-white flower clusters at an early age, turning from green to brown

Serviceberry is a small and appealing tree through the seasons. Serviceberries have become a popular choice for planting in parks, yards and on streets. It requires a well-trained soil and does well in full sun or moderate shade and is winter hardy. The tree grows at a medium rate. It blooms white in the spring and red at maturity. It poses no serious insect or disease problems.

Mature Size: Height: 20 to 25 feet
Width: 10 to 20 feet



Skyline Honey Locust is a very water thrifty and heat tolerant. Another good reason to plant the Honey locust is because they drop their leaved earlier in the fall which keeps them from being damaged by early hard freezes and heavy snow. Finely textured, dark green, fern-like foliage turns golden yellow in the fall.

Mature Size: Height: 35 to 45 feet
Width: 30 to 40 feet
