President's Report

President Chmura announced that Chick-fil-A will be opening a location on the east side of the show property. Harlem Irving Properties is working on other leases as well. Chick-fil-A is expected to open in three to five months. The restaurant is closed on Sundays. Miller's Ale has been doing very well since opening and the theatre is expected to open on August 25, 2017.

- (a) Adopt and approve Ordinance No. 1895-17, "AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING AN APPROPRIATION FOR CORPORATE PURPOSES AND STATEMENT OF ANTICIPATED REVENUES FOR THE FISCAL YEAR COMMENCING MAY 1, 2017 AND ENDING APRIL 30, 2018 FOR THE VILLAGE OF NORRIDGE, COOK COUNTY ILLINOIS: The Budget and Appropriation Ordinance and Statement of Anticipated Revenues."
- (b) Concur with the recommendation of the Zoning Board of Appeals to DENY the petition of Mr. Paul Copiak, 6767 Milwaukee Avenue, Niles (Attorney for Bloodline), on behalf of one of the proposed owners of Bloodline, Mr. Roman Siemionka, requesting a special use permit under the requirements of Article X-B-3 General Business District Section 5 - Special Uses of the Zoning Ordinances of the Village of Norridge 1962, for the purpose of operating a tattoo establishment at the property located at 7601 W. Montrose, hearing held on May 1, 2017, Case No. 620.

- (c) Accept Fire Alarm Report from the Norwood Park Fire Protection District for the month of April 2017.
- (d) Accept, as a matter of record, payments made to the Police Department's eligible employees for Holiday Buy Backs from Fiscal Year 2016-2017 totaling \$82,737.24. Of this amount, \$9,024.97 is for 5 Police Department Civilian employees and \$73,712.27 is for 26 Police Department Union employees. Payments were made via payroll on the pay date of May 15, 2017.

- (b) Accept letter of resignation from Advisory Review Committee Member Michael A. Glaub, effective April 30, 2017.
- (c) Accept Renewal Proposal from Blue Cross Blue Shield of Illinois to provide medical insurance to eligible full-time Village employees effective May 01, 2017 through April 30, 2018 with the following monthly rates:
