President Chmura had nothing under the Presidents Report to review.

FINANCE, LICENSES & CONTRACTS, Trustee Gregorio:

Trustee Gregorio had no discussion items to review. She asked if there were any questions in regards to her consent agenda. There were none.

LAW & ORDINANCE & ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, Trustee Falagario:

Trustee Falagario visited Nordstrom Rack and the AMC property. Nordstrom is scheduled to open on October 28, 2017 and AMC on October 4, 2017. Also announced was a Popeye's will be opening in the Courtyard at the Harlem Irving Plaza.

POLICE, Trustee Kucharskí:

Trustee Kucharski mentioned item (a) under Discussion was in committee and needed to be moved to her Consent Agenda. It will become item (c) under Consent Agenda.

Motion by Kucharski, seconded by Gregorio to:

- (a) Accept letter dated September 11, 2017 from Police Chief David Disselhorst informing the Village Board that Ann Marie Grenke has satisfactorily completed her training for the Crossing Guard position. The Board concurs with his recommendation that she be promoted to Reserve Crossing Guard retroactive to July 16, 2017 at a rate of \$18.00 per hour.
- (b) Accept letter dated September 11, 2017 from Police Chief David Disselhorst informing the Village Board that William Stach has satisfactorily completed his training for the Crossing Guard position. The Board concurs with his recommendation that he be promoted to Reserve Crossing Guard retroactive to July 16, 2017 at a rate of \$18.00 per hour.
- (c) Approve for payment Invoice #102, dated August 23, 2017 from Municipal Consolidated Dispatch, 7300 W. Wilson Avenue, Harwood Heights, IL in the amount of \$224,341.67, installment 1 of 3 of FY2017-2018 billing for Norridge's share of 911 dispatch center expenses.

PUBLIC WORKS, WATER, TREE PROGRAM, PARKING, STREET LIGHT CABLE REPLACEMENT PROJECT: Trustee Tannhauser:

Trustee Tannhauser mentioned:

(a) As a matter of record: On September 15, 2017 a payment was mailed to the IEPA in the amount of \$73,841.99 for the water meter loan. This was payment #29 of 30. The remaining loan balance due is \$67,473.67, with a final payment due date of March 31, 2018. The loan originated May 8, 2003 and was for \$2,208,891.38.

Trustee Tannhauser had no other discussion items for review. He read item (e) under the Consent Agenda for clarification. Brian Gaseor mentioned that the second paving company that

was selected for the surface and patching program has been approved by IDOT as well as Edwin Hancock Engineering. There were no other questions in regards to the project or the remaining consent agenda items.

Motion by Tannhauser, seconded by Sulimowski to:

(a) Accept Water Fund Monthly Financial Report for the month ending July 31, 2017 as published.

(b) Accept the Water Fund Accounts Payable Check Register for the month of August,

2017, as published.

(c) Accept Coliform Results report from Suburban Laboratories, Inc. as required by the IEPA Community Water Supply Testing Fund Program, of water sample analysis performed September 11, 2017.

(d) Accept Coliform Results report from Suburban Laboratories, Inc. as required by the IEPA Community Water Supply Testing Fund Program, of water sample analysis

performed September 18, 2017.

(e) Concur with the recommendation of Edwin Hancock Engineering and enter into agreement with J.A. Johnson Paving Company for the Motor Fuel Tax Fund 2017 Surface Patching Program, bid amount \$247,407.00. Although the lowest bid submitted for this project was Brothers Asphalt Paving, Inc. with a bid of \$207,457.45, they requested their bid be withdrawn due to an error in calculating the unit price for one of the pay items in the bid.

(f) Accept proposal dated September 20, 2017 from RJN Group, Inc., 200 W. Front Street, Wheaton, IL 60187 for professional engineering services for the 2017 Dyed Water Flooding project as part of the Short Term Requirements for the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District Infiltration and Inflow Control Program. Project to be

completed by April 30, 2018 with costs not to exceed \$57,800.00.

Kucharski, Tannhauser, Sulimowski, Falagario, Gregorio, Gelsomino Yea. Nays none. Motion carried.

GENERAL, Clerk Budnik:

Clerk Budnik mentioned Coffee and Conversation with Mayor Chmura will be on Saturday, September 30, 2017 beginning promptly at 9:30 AM. Commissioner Peter Silvestri will also be in attendance.

President Chmura mentioned that Commissioner Silvestri voted against the county sugar tax.

Ms. Polous mentioned a conversation she had with District 80 Superintendent Paul O'Malley. She contacted him in regards to the traffic issues at Leigh School and asked if there was anything being done to help alleviate the challenges. It has been a problem since day one of school and not gotten any better. He informed her that the traffic issue was not his problem. It is a Village of Norridge problem.

A short response was given by both Mayor Chmura and Trustee Tannhauser. They will continue to monitor the concerns and work with Chief Disselhorst on resolutions.
