Specifically, (1) the requirement in 5 ILCS 120/2.01 that "members of a public body must be physically present" is suspended.

President Tannhauser asked all to stand and pledge allegiance to the flag.

Motion by Gelsomino, seconded by Larson to approve and adopt the minutes of the Regular Board Meeting of May 27, 2020 as presented.

President's Report

President Tannhauser mentioned:

(a) Declaration of Local State of Emergency – Supplement #3, was issued and signed by President Tannhauser on May 29, 2020.

(b) Declaration of Local State of Emergency – Supplement #4, to be issued upon more information from Governor Pritzker as it pertains to moving into Phase 4 of the Restore Illinois Plan.

- (c) Village President's Executive Order Relating to the corona virus pandemic, Supplement #4 was issued and signed by President Tannhauser on June 16, 2020:
 - Supplements and Continues Prior Executive Orders.
 - A. This Village President's Executive Order #4 supplements and continues my previous Executive Orders dated March 23, 2020, April 8, 2020, April 27, 2020, and May 29, 2020.
 - B. Section 12 of my previous Village President's Executive Order #3 dated May 29, 2020 be and hereby is modified as follows: **Garage and Estate Sales** are now permitted subject to compliance with Governor Pritzker's executive order E.O. #2020-38. Face coverings, social distancing, and limitation of no more than 10 persons in a gathering at any one time is required.
 - 2. **Authority**. This Executive Order is issued by me under my authority as Village President and Local Liquor Commissioner pursuant to Chapter 26 of the Revised Municipal Code of the Village of Norridge 2002 ("Village Code") and Ordinance 1986-20 and Village Code Chapter 6, Section 6-43 8.e. wherein the Local Liquor Commissioner shall have the authority to amend, alter, suspend, or revoke, or expand regulations relating to those license classes subject to regulation under the Village Code, with reasonable notice to affected licensees, by executive order during the effective period of the Gubernatorial Disaster Proclamation and subsequent Executive Order 2020-07 without the prior approval of the Village Board of Trustees.
 - 3. **T-E Licensees Outdoor Dining and Service of Alcoholic Liquor.** During the effective period of the on-site consumption ban and the Declaration of Local State of Emergency, the Local Liquor Control Commissioner of the Village may, subject to Phase 3 of the Restore Illinois Plan issued by the Governor on May 24, 2020, effective May, 29, 2020, permit a holder of a T-E license to provide outdoor dining and/or service of alcoholic liquor in accordance with the Phase 3 Restore Illinois Plan Guidelines for Restaurants and Bars which provide, in part, for:
 - a. Outdoor dining and/or drinking only; and
 - b. Limited to parties of 6 persons or fewer; and
 - c. Tables to be a minimum of 6 feet apart.
 - 4. **Outdoor Dining Restaurant With No Liquor License.** During the effective period of the on-site consumption ban and the Declaration of Local State of Emergency, restaurants that do not have a liquor license and wish to provide outdoor dining not including the service of alcoholic liquor may do so subject to the Phase 3 Restore Illinois Plan Guidelines for Restaurants and Bars which provide, in part, for:
 - a. Outdoor dining only; and
 - b. Limited to parties of 6 persons or fewer; and
 - c. Tables to be a minimum of 6 feet apart.
 - 5. **Village Regulations Apply**. All restaurants whether licensed to serve alcohol beverages, or not, and all T-E license holders wishing to provide outdoor dining and/or service of alcoholic liquor (if applicable), shall meet all Village health, sanitation, inspection and permitting requirements.

- 6. Delivery and Carryout of Mixed Drinks and Cocktails for Consumption Off-Premises. Delivery and carryout of mixed drinks and cocktails for consumption off-premises is permitted during the effective period of the on-site consumption ban and the Declaration of Local State of Emergency by a holder of a T-E license (provided that a T-E licensee is licensed to deliver mixed drinks or cocktails and is the holder of a State of Illinois 1A Retailer Liquor License) to provide delivery and carryout of mixed drinks and cocktails for consumption off-premises in accordance with the Governor's Executive Order 2020-38, Section 6-28.8 of the Illinois Liquor Control Act (235 ILCS 5/6-28.8) and the Illinois Liquor Control Commission's COVID -19 Related Action Sale and Delivery of "To Go" Mixed Drinks/Cocktails dated June 2, 2020 ("Cocktails To Go Guidelines"). A licensee delivering mixed drinks and cocktails under this section must comply with all Cocktails To Go Guidelines which provide, in part:
- a. Cocktails can only be delivered in a sealed, labeled container with a tamper-evident cap or seal by an employee of the liquor license holder who is over the age of 21 and trained in responsible alcohol service.
- b. Cocktails may not be delivered via a third-party delivery app.
- c. Cocktails can only be delivered after an employee verifies the age as well as the level of intoxication of the consumer.

In addition, delivery and carryout of mixed drinks and cocktails under this section are only permitted with an accompanying food order totaling at least \$10.00 and are subject to the following additional limitations.

- a. Quantity is limited to five (5) per food order.
- b. No sale, take out or delivery after 12:00 a.m.
- c. For off-premises delivery, the employee or agent making the delivery must require identification verifying proof of age and the signature of the individual to whom delivery is made. The licensee must maintain a record of all deliveries, which must include: (1) the name of the delivery driver, (2) name of the purchaser, (3) the address where the delivery was made, (4) the name, date of birth, and signature of the person to whom delivery was made, and (5) a list of all the alcohol delivered. All delivery records must be kept by the licensee for at least six months and the records must be immediately made available for examination and copying to the Village of Norridge Police Department or the Local Liquor Commissioner upon request.
- d. Take out, curbside or off-premises delivery may not be made to any person who is intoxicated.
- e. Curbside delivery may not be made to a vehicle if any occupant of that vehicle is intoxicated.
- 7. **T-E Licensees Additional State Law Requirements.** T-E licensees are advised that additional steps may be required pursuant to State law to undertake the actions described in this Executive Order, including but not limited to receiving a State license in an off-premises consumption category.
- 8. **Insurance Requirements.** All T-E licensees shall ensure that their Dram Shop/liquor liability insurance policies are updated and/or revised to enable such a licensee to undertake the actions permitted by this Executive Order and shall submit evidence of same to the Village in the application process. In submitting the

required insurance certificates licensees certify the sufficiency of their Dram Shop/liquor liability insurance policy and indemnify the Village of Norridge and its employees and agents from any and all liability related to any and all claims that arise directly or indirectly from any activities undertaken by the licensee.

- 9. **Expiration Date.** This Executive Order #4 shall remain in effect until June 30, 2020, or until further order of the Village President and the Local Liquor Commissioner, or repeal or amendment of these regulations by ordinance by the Village President and Village Board of Trustees, or unless superseded by State law, or by further executive order of the Governor of the State of Illinois, whichever is earlier.
- 10. **Violation.** Violation of the provisions of a Class T-E license or other applicable provisions of Chapter Article 6 of the Revised Municipal Code of the Village of Norridge 2002 shall result in an immediate suspension of a Class T-E license and may result in the suspension or revocation of the licensee's Class A or Class F license.
- 11. **Governor's Authority.** Nothing in this Executive Order Supplement #4 shall supersede the Governor's authority and any orders that may be issued by the Governor related to the operation of businesses and /or the sale of alcoholic liquor in the State of Illinois.
- 12. **Effective Date.** This Executive Order #4 shall be effective immediately upon its promulgation and shall be deposited with the Village Clerk, posted at Village Hall, and entered on the Village's website.

Jane Horn and Vladimir Tkalcevic

A letter was received from Ms. Horn and Mr. Tkalcevic. They are long time residents of the Village and have seen many changes specifically the size and appearance of homes bringing a new way of life and behavior.

Example being their neighbor at 4925 N. Crescent who installed a 6' privacy fence which they said was for their dog that might jump over and cause damage. They did not object to the fence. Since installed the back yard has been filled with chairs, swimming pools, fire pit creating a gathering and entertainment space. They have the right to do that however they do not have the right to disturb the peace of other neighbors by playing loud music.

They are trying to add a giant projection TV screen 11' high which projects the light and picture to their house located 20' from the screen. They were asked what they were doing and the screen came down and they became unfriendly.

They have learned that the neighbors are still considering adding the TV and Ms. Horn and Mr.

Tkalcevic have asked Brian Gaseor if there is an ordinance prohibiting this. He said he is not aware of one.

Ms. Horn and Mr. Tkalcevic would like to ask the Village Trustees to consider this matter and establish an ordinance to restrict giant projection TV's in residential areas.

Nick Comerford

Mr. Comerford asked the Village to consider eliminating the fence code requirements of 25% opening/aperture
