President's Report

President Tannhauser reviewed:

- (a) Village President's Executive Order relating to the corona virus pandemic, Supplement #19 was issued and signed on October 31, 2021 and will be in effect until November 30, 2021.
- (b) Declaration of Local State of Emergency Supplement #19, was issued and signed by President Tannhauser on November 1, 2021 and will be in effect until November 30, 2021.
- (c) On October 14, 2021 The Village of Norridge received the Certificate of the official 2020 Decennial Census figures indicating the number of inhabitants in our municipality. Whereas, Section 1-7-2 of the "Illinois Municipal Code" provides that the Secretary of State shall certify to each municipality the number of its inhabitants as shown by the latest census taken by authority of the United States; and Whereas, a copy of the 2020 Decennial Census taken April 1, 2020 has been filed and it appears from such certificate that the Village of Norridge, has 15,251 inhabitants.

President Tannhauser had no other items.

Accolades

Trustee Budnik read a letter received from a village resident thanking Corporal Zachery Zage, Officer Sara Cvikota and Officer Thomas Wysocki expressing her gratitude for the way the Officers dealt with her 12 year old son. Comments from the Public.

There were no comments emailed to the Village Administrator prior to the meeting. There were no in person comments.

<u>Presentation by the Water Committee</u>: Protecting the Future of our Village Water System

Trustee Ronstadt, Village Administrator Skupien and Public Works Superintendent Spain gave a presentation titled: Protecting the Future of our Village Water System. There were two previous Community Meetings which were held that this presentation was given. The first meeting was on Thursday, October 14th at 7:00 PM and the second one on Saturday, October 16th at 11:00 AM. The Community Meetings were held at the Estelle Sieb Community Center. Trustee Ronstadt mentioned that for anyone who was unable to make it to the Community Meetings, the PowerPoint presentation has been available for viewing on the Village's website and will remain up there.

The presentation included information about:

- The current state of the Village's Water System, including the age and life expectancies of the components
- The expected costs of future projects
- The current cost of water for our residents compared to neighboring communities
- The (then) proposed increase to the water infrastructure fee, which will be voted on at tonight's meeting, in order to help fund some of the future projects to make sure our water system is protected and our water is safe. The proposed increase was presented at both of the community meetings. And a breakdown of how it would affect the water bills was detailed out. The increase which will go into effect, assuming it passes the Board vote tonight, correlates to an increase of \$0.35 per day.

Trustee Ronstadt recapped comments, feedback, suggestions and questions which were received at the previous Community Meetings. Those meetings were well attended and some people in attendance stated that they have rentals in other nearby communities or recently moved from other nearby communities and shared how much more the water bills are in the other communities.

One person in the audience asked questions regarding the content and those questions were answered.
